This unparalleled tool comprises 365,000 records of articles and is OpenUrl compatible.

The Bibliographie de civilisation médiévale has been established by the Centre d'Études Supérieures de Civilisation Médiévale (Université de Poitiers) and aims to provide a comprehensive, current bibliography of monographs and miscellany volumes worldwide. The BCM contains 50,000 bibliographic records of monographs. This reference work is also OpenUrl compatible.


